Draughts is London's first ever board game café, and when it opened in winter of 2014, it took the city by storm, or out of one in fact. The café has turned the common conception of a dreaded family games night involving a fight with your brother over ignoring the do not pass go sign or getting mad at Uncle Paul because

Groups of professionals queue up for a chance to have a night of board game fun, with a choice of over 600 games, great food and snacks, and a range of local craft beers, ales, ciders, and wines for all those late night sessions. The cafe also hosts tournaments, themed evenings and design workshops with professional board game designers there to teach.

The café prides itself on its experience, knowledgeable and friendly staff better know as 'game gurus' to help your group pick the best suited game and explain the rules.




Once your tour is complete, grab a drink at The Brewery Bar, which serves their beers on tap, alongside a rotating guest list of well known London street food vendors.

#### 2. BROADWAY MARKET

Broadway Market London E8 4QJ

This East London market sells a diverse mix of items from local farmers produce, to unique art pieces, one-of-a-kind furniture and weird and wonderful clothes. The market also boasts a fabulous coffee and café scene.

### 3. COLUMBIA ROAD FLOWER MARKET

Columbia Road London E2 7RG

If you fancy yourself a bit of gardening, look no further than the ever-popular Columbia Road flower market; the one stop destination for plants, shrubs, flowers and all gardening accessories. Stroll through the rows of floral arrangements and pick up some tricks of the trade from any of the seasoned stall owners.

## 4. COVENT GARDEN MARKET

### 6. OLD SPITALFIELDS MARKET

Horner Square London E1 6EW

The Old Spitalfields Market packs a fantastic line up. Thursday welcomes an antiques market, offering an array of vintage collectables. Friday boasts a line up on unique designers, showcasing clothing and art. And finally on the first and third Friday of the month, the market hosts the record fair, welcoming music lovers from all over London to explore vintage vinyl across all music genres.

# 7. PORTOBELLO ROAD MARKET

Portobello Road London W11 3DG

If you have seen the much loved movie Notting Hill, you are probably familiar with the image of Hugh Grant walking through the stalls of Portobello Road Market. Here, search through treasures at one of the bric-a-brac stalls, nab yourself a deal on vintage trench coats at one of the clothing shops or walk down the pastel palette lanes of Notting Hill, coffee in hand.

# 8. SOUTHBANK CENTRE MARKET

Belvedere Road London SE1 8XX

### 9. GREENWICH MARKET

The team at the club can also cater to groups, creating bespoke comedy evenings for groups and hosting from a location convenient to you. So if it is a LOL you are after, Soho Comedy Club have got you covered.

If you are feeling adventurous and somewhat forgiving, head over to Shambles Comedy Club, where really, the clue is in the title. Shambles is a fortnightly comedy night hosted in North London. It welcomes stand up Comedians from all walks of life,

giving them a platform to try new material. The evenings are unprediactable and somewhat chaotic, but always guaranteed a good time. The club is run by Harry Deansway, a well known name in the London comedy scene and a man who knows pretty much every exciting comedia out there. Whatsmore, the night is hosted in Aces & Eights, a quaint saloon bar/ pizza joint, creating the perfect, intimate setting for an evening of laughs... or cringes.

Oasis, Amy Winehouse and The Rolling Stones, all incredibly talented and famous British artists and sharing one commonality; they started their careers playing gigs on a stage, in some dingy bar in London. So it is safe to say, we have a pretty good live music offering in the city.

So if live music takes your fancy, here are a couple of recommendations. Pop down to Ronnie Scott's, one of London's oldest established jazz clubs. Founded in 1959, saxophonist Ronnie Scott opened an intimate basement club where like-minded musicians could meet and perform to a walk in audience. The speak easy vibe not only plays live jazz, but upstairs guests can dance the night away to Latin, jive

flamenco and more.

Another noteable spot in the capital is Blue's Kitchen, in Shoreditch, East London. The perfect venue for a group dinner and drinks, followed by busting a move on the dance floor to a live brass, soul band. Expect to hear all the classics covered, from Stevie Wonder to Tina Turner and Earth, Wind and Fire.

Alternatively, if you would like to stay in house for the evening, attend a session of Raw Punch, a live music evening hosted in Punch Room; our intimate bar nestled at the back of the hotel. The bar is a fumed-oak panelled den inspired by the comfort of manor house libraries and nineteenth-century London's private

clubs, yet a modern reincarnation. With an open fire and cosy velvet seating, there is no better place to hunker down with a hot dickens punch and listen to live music.

Every other Sunday, Punch Room plays host to up and coming musicians welcoming talent such as Jones, Tusks and Zak Abel; each exhibit their unique and soulful sounds.

Inspired by unique destinations, their histories and natural beauty, the menu boasts cocktails that evoke an experience in itself.

A personal favourite from the menu is Via Ferrata. Made with alpine cordial, sweet Vermouth and mint, the drink pays homage to the 'iron road' climbing route through the Alps and the people who used them as a means of life. The flavours are influenced by the local ingredients of the area as well as the ration packs of

Italian soldiers during WWI & WWII. If these cocktails sound interesting to you, well you're in luck! Our Bar Tenders are happy to host group sessions, doing step by step tutorials whilst explaining how the ideas came about and where they have drawn inspiration from... and most importantly, getting tasters!
